Module Title: AI @ Tractor Supply - Purpose, Ethics & Culture

Module Overview

Welcome to the foundation of our GPT Innovation Team. This module will ground you in the mission behind our AI efforts and prepare you to build, test, and lead with purpose. You'll learn how Tractor Supply's values translate into the way we use AI, and how every interaction with our GPT agent should reflect our culture of professionalism, servant leadership, and practical innovation.

Learning Objectives

By the end of this module, you will be able to:

- 1. Describe the mission and objectives of Tractor Supply's GPT initiative
- 2. Explain how our GPT agent works (RAG = Retrieval-Augmented Generation)
- 3. Identify and apply our 4 Al guardrails: friendly, moral, professional, clear
- 4. Use the 5-question governance lens to evaluate prompts, SOPs, and outputs
- 5. Understand your role in building a smarter, people-centered knowledge agent

Part 1: Why Are We Doing This?

"Knowledge walks out the door every day. Some of it retires. Some transfers. Some burns out. Our GPT agent is here to preserve that knowledge, empower our teams, and help people make faster, smarter decisions - on any shift, in any department, without waiting on an SME."

We're building a "virtual" teammate that:

- · Speaks like us
- Respects people
- Helps without judgment
- Never stops improving

This is how we future-proof leadership and raise the floor for every team member.

We use a model called **Retrieval-Augmented Generation (RAG)**. Here's how it works in 30 seconds:

- You ask a question (prompt)
- GPT searches structured files in our database (not just public AI knowledge)
- It pulls the right content chunks, thinks about your request, and writes an answer
- If trained well, it gives you instant guidance that feels like a real supervisor or SME

Your job: Help us feed it the right knowledge, tone, and workflows.

Part 3: Our 4 GPT Guardrails

<u>Guardrail</u>	<u>Description</u>
Friendly	Helpful, encouraging, down-to-earth - like a good coach
Moral	Never manipulative, biased, or disrespectful
Professional	Clear, respectful, appropriate for all levels
Clear	Straightforward answers that guide action (not jargon or fluff)

Part 4: The 5-Question Governance Lens

Before you approve or publish anything (prompt, SOP, etc), ask:

- 1. Does this reflect Tractor Supply's values and culture?
- 2. Is it moral, respectful, and unbiased?
- 3. Would I feel good if this answer was given to my team?
- 4. Is it helpful, friendly, and professional?
- 5. Is it accurate and easy to understand?

If the answer is "no" to any of those - don't publish it. Fix it or escalate it.

Part 5: Our Operating Rhythm

You're part of a high-performing team. Here's how we work:
